Notes:

1. People in Emergency Shelter decreased 15% due to fewer winter shelter beds available in 2026.
2. People in TH decreased 46% from 2025 due to TH beds converting to permanent housing.
3. Number of seniors aged 62 or older decreased 50%. Unsheltered seniors decreased by 9 individuals.
4. Unsheltered people decreased 11% from the 2025 count. This decrease was among single individuals or households without children. Chronically homeless sheltered individuals decreased 31% from 2025 while chronically homeless unsheltered individuals increased by 8%. Unsheltered veterans increased by 2 people. However the total # of veterans counted of 35 is 3 less than in 2025.
5. There was a 21% increase in the # of people counted within unsheltered families in 2026.
